I. NOVI CHRISTIAN ACADEMY SCHOOL-WIDE LEARNING OUTCOMES

The vision of Novi Christian Academy educators is that a maturing NCA student:

- 1. Professes understanding and committing to a personal relationship with Christ and demonstrates ongoing spiritual development.
 - Can explain the gospel message
 - Pursues spiritual maturity and a deepening dependence upon the Holy Spirit by practicing spiritual disciplines such as devotions, personal Bible study, prayer, memorization, and attending a local church
- 2. Develops, articulates, and defends a biblical world view and operates from that perspective.
 - Is able to communicate differences between Christianity and other worldviews
 - Trains to dialog effectively with those who hold other worldviews
 - Trains to defend one's faith
- 3. Is academically prepared in all required areas to be ready for the next desired level of academic pursuit.

The following may be included:

- > Demonstrates creative and critical thinking by applying learning to solve problems
- Utilizes technology responsibly and effectively
- > Can appropriately access and use various types of information resources
- Participates in Fine Arts
- > Demonstrates competence in reading, writing, speaking, and listening
- Practices appropriate testing, both standardized and school-selected
- Communicates in written and verbal form in a different language
- Displays a biblical worldview in the various disciplines
- 4. Develops moral integrity, demonstrated by righteous living and stewardship. Opportunities to foster moral integrity may include the following:
 - > Analyzes right choices using biblical principles
 - > Practices wise stewardship in use of personal, financial, and natural resources
 - Demonstrates doing work/assessment with honesty and responsibility
 - Participates in accountability/mentoring activities
 - > Defines and/or presents moral integrity in technology usage
- 5. Is able to relate well and work well with others respecting the worth of every individual as made in God's image and demonstrating the fruit of the Spirit:
 - > Explains being created in the image of God and how God wants all life to be sacred
- 6. Shows a love for learning, thereby, displaying intellectual, spiritual, physical, social, and emotional health:
 - > Excels or exceeds the minimum standard required on an assignment or project
 - Demonstrates learning that leads to healthy/righteous lifestyle choices in school activities or assessments
 - Demonstrates and/or explains the spiritual implications of acting upon one's learning
- 7. Demonstrates servant leadership through service and missions using spiritual giftedness. The following may be included:

- Articulates the biblical mandate for service and missions, including responsibility to the poor and lost
- Participates in service experiences
- Understands missions from personal experience or from personal exposure to the message/impact of missions
- > Participates, develops and/or applies leadership skills
- > Analyzes and utilizes spiritual gifts, personal strengths, and talent
